I beg to report that on the 26th.

O'Malley, Galway, called between 9 & 10
p. m., but Clarke was not there at the
time.

C. W. Power arrived at Amiens St. from
Dundalk at 10. 30 a. m. They returned
to Dundalk by 3 p. m. train. R. I. C.
informed.

J. J. O'Connell arrived at Amiens
St. at 5. 35 p. m. from Carrickmore. He
was afterwards seen in company of Bulmer
Hobson and P. Ryan (Sinn Fein).

arrived at Kingstown, per Mail Boat from
