Thomas Byrne for an hour from 11 a. m. on Joseph McGuinness for a quarter Saturday. of an hour between 8 & 9 p. m. C. J. Kickham for twenty minutes between 9 & 10 p. m.

John Fitzgibbon who had earlier in the day returned from Dundalk, left Broadstone at 5 p. m. in company of Jas. O'Connor, en route to Edenderry. R. I. C. informed.

J. J. Walsh in his shop, 26 Blessington St. between 9 & 10 p. m.

Thomas Byrne and William Sheehan were the only suspects seen to visit Clarke on Sunday.

It has been reported to the Police
that between 12 & 1 a. m. 15th Inst. several
men forcibly removed 4 wooden cases, each
containing 25 Martini Metford rifles from the
L. & N. W. Rwy. Stores, Nth. Wall, addressed
to Mr John E. Redmond, M. P., 44 Parnell Sqr.
and carried them away for some distance, from
which they were removed by motor car, destination
unknown. Inquiry proceeding.
