It has been reported to the Police that between 12 & 1 a. m. 15th Inst. several men forcibly removed 4 wooden cases, each containing 25 Martini Metford rifles from the L. & N. W. Rwy. Stores, Nth. Wall, addressed to Mr John E. Redmond, M. P., 44 Parnell Sqr. and carried them away for some distance, from which they were removed by motor car, destination unknown. Inquiry proceeding.
