Buggy for twenty minutes between 7 & 8 p.m. John T. Kelly and Wm. O'Leary Curtis together for over an hour from 8. 45 p. m. James Murray for half an hour between 10 & 11 p. m.

W. P. Partridge arrived at Kingsbridge from Cork at 12. 30 p. m.
