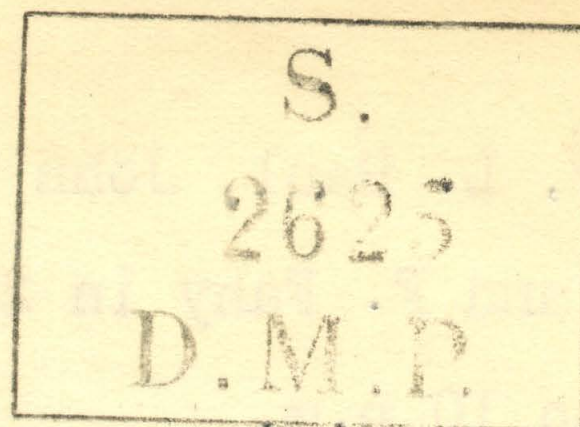

Subject, MOVEMENTS OF DUBLIN EXTREMISTS.

Bulmer Hobson, Thomas McDonagh, H. Mellows, John McNeill, J. J. O'Connell, M. O'Hanrahan, Joseph McGuinness, T. J. McSweeney, Cork, and Pierce McCann, Cashel, in 2, Dawson St., for an hour, from 12 noon.

Pierce Beasley and E. O'Duffy, together, in College Green, between 12 and 1 p.m.

M. J. O'Rahilly and E. O'Duffy in 2, Dawson St., between 1 and 2 p.m.

Pierce McCann returned to Thurles and T. J. McSweeney to Cork, by 3 p.m. train. They travelled in separate compartments.

Charles Shannon left Amiens St., by 6 p.m. train for Belfast. R.I.C. in each instance informed.
