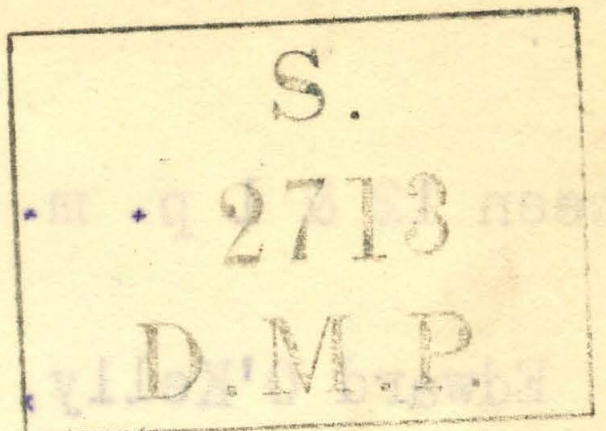

Subject, MOVEMENTS OF DUBLIN EXTREMISTS.
