Pearse; John Fitzgibbon; Wm. Mellows; Joseph Plunkett; Bulmer Hobson; E. Kent; John McDermott; Thomas McDonagh; J. J. O'Connell; Denis McCullough, Belfast, and Patrick Hughes, Dundalk. The proceedings which commenced at 12 noon, continued until 3.30 p.m., when those taking part were seen to leave the building.

James Connolly and P. T. Daly addressed a small meeting between 1 & 2 p. m. 19th inst., in Beresford Place. The proceedings which lasted less than half an hour were exclusively confined to questions as to the existing dispute at the Docks of the City of Dublin Steam Packet Co., North Wall.
