

ster, she had signed a Memorial to the Prime
Minister requesting that an adequate
number of capable women should be
included in the Royal Commission on the
Poor Law - It was decided that 12/-
should be forwarded to London, as payment
for the Irish flag - which is to be displayed

at future meetings of the W.S. association
in England &c -

Mrs. Haslam reported that she had attended
as delegate the annual Convention of the
National Union of Women's Suffrage Societies,
held at Hull from the 18th to the 21st ult.,
and also the annual meeting of the National
Union of Women Workers, held at Bir-
mingham from the 23rd to the 26th ult. At Hull
the greatest enthusiasm prevailed. Sixty new
committees have been formed in the United
Kingdom; an unprecedented number of meet-
ings and demonstrations have been held
throughout the year; and especially in the
North of England the working women, now
loyally supported by the Independent Labour
party, are throwing themselves into the move-
ment with intense earnestness and zeal. At the
public meeting held in the Royal Institu-
tion, under the presidency of Mr. Lake White,
M.P., Sir John Balliol, M.P., assisting,
the following resolution was moved by Mr.
Lesl Jones, M.P., seconded by Miss Hal-
garne, supported by Lady Dorothy Howard,
and several other speakers, and carried by
acclamation:—"That this meeting is strongly
of opinion that no scheme of redistribution
can be satisfactory to the country which is
not accompanied by such electoral reform as
shall admit women to the register as Parlia-
mentary voters, and calls upon His Majesty's
Government to carry out this urgent and long-
delayed reform." At Birmingham the sub-
jects dealt with covered a much wider field,
and valuable papers were read upon "The
Cotswold Lodging House," "Vacation Schools,"
"Play Centres," "Parental Responsibility,"
"The Treatment of Criminal Children,"
"Children's Courts of Justice," "The Prob-
ation System," "Emigration under its various
aspects of Families, Elder Girls for Service,
and Children to Canada"; "The Destitute,"
and various ways of helping them;" "The
Colony System," "Free Food for School
Children," and "The teaching of the simple
rules of Health and Temperance in Element-
ary and Secondary Schools." The reception
given by the Lord Mayor and Lady Mayoress
included about one thousand guests, and the
Conference ended with an appropriate sermon
in the Cathedral from the Lord Bishop of Bir-
mingham, and a most interesting visit to
Bournville.
