to all the Irish M.P.'s urging them to vote for Mr. Dickenson's Bill, also to all our subscribers, asking them to write to as many M.P.'s as practicable the same effect. As the belief has been largely responded to - much disappointment was felt at the rejection of Mr. Dickenson's Bill, owing largely to the hostile vote of a large number of our Irish M.P.'s & the following Resolution was proposed by Miss Harper, 2nd of Mrs. C. R. Lownthorpe & carried unanimously. "The Committee of the W.S.T.G.L. while deeply deplored the fresh outbreak of outrages on the part of a small number of misguided suffragists which is following the rejection of Mr. Dickenson's Bill regret that they cannot exonerate our Irish representatives who voted against that proposed measure of justice to women from a large share of responsibility for the recurrence of those outrages." The Hon. Secy has instructed to send copy of same to all the Dublin daily papers & also the respective M.P.'s - & also thanking the M.P.'s who had voted for us.

Lady Dockrell will if possible attend the Congress at Braga Portu in June as our Fraternal delegate - Mrs Salomones Mrs Townshend & Mr Moscardi the NDUW Conference in Hull in October - several letters were read including one from Mr. Hagg - The Committee adjourned to Sept 18th

Lady Dockrell gave an interesting account of her experiences at the International Congress Budapest Mr. Haslam followed with a short account of the experiences of himself & Mr. Haslam with the Belgian &

Claudius Branches of the N.W.S.S. on the memorable Pilgrimage from all parts of Great Britain to London in June & July, culminating in a great Demonstration in Hyde Park which was an unequalled success - It was decided to send 10/- as our contribution to the W. S.
McLaren Memorial - Several interesting letters were read, W^m Coby, Miss Ashton, W^m Stodder Lady Wright & report from Claudius relative to their 6 Larations for Women, which Mr^t Harlan had brought under the notice of the Lord Mayor & several other members of the Corporation - also letter from the Refugee League suggesting some joint action of our Irish Societies in the Piccadilly case, the Committee considered the proposal inexpedient & undesirable. S. as it might prove too cumbersome - as W^m Colby from Oregon is coming to Dublin, W^m Maccaid has sent a telegram to Dr. R. Meetee for her if she can attend - W^m Solomons & Mrs Maccaid gave very interesting accounts of the proceedings at the N.C.W.W. Congress at Hull Mr Townsend sent a contribution on the same subjects - The matter dealt with were as usual exceedingly important & W^m H. Ward's attempt to exclude W. S. was defeated - W^m Sanderson, on behalf of the sub-committee

reported that they had interviewed, or written to various members of the Committee as indicated & that fully 4/5th of the number were strongly of opinion that the Association should not be dissolved - several promised to increase their subscriptions with the object of taking an office & employing a paid Secretary, but there being no prospect of a sufficient amount being raised, & Mr^W Haslance feeling unable to continue to fulfill the duties of Hon Sec the following resolution was proposed by Mr^W Keatinge 2nd, Mr^W Ferguson and carried unanimous - "That in the opinion of this meeting, the Society shall continue on the same lines as heretofore, & that Mr^W Sanderson be asked to undertake the Hon Secretaryship in the place of Mr^W Haslance & that Mr^W Hallam be elected President."
