MOVEMENTS OF DUBLIN EXTREMISTS.

I beg to report that on the 4th and 5th inst. the undermentioned extremists were observed moving about and associating with each other as follows:-

With Thomas J. Clarke, 75 Parnell St., on Saturday F. Fahy and C. Colbert for half an hour between 8 & 9 p.m. James Murray for twenty minutes from 9 p.m. Pierce Beasley and Con Collins, G.P.O., together, from 9.45 p.m. to 10 p.m.

T.J. McSweeney arrived at Kingsbridge from Cork at 12.30 p.m. Bulmer Hobson and Herbert Mellows together in Volunteer Office 2 Dawson St. at 1 p.m.

Mr. John McNeill left Kingsbridge by 2.30 p.m. train en route to Killarney. R.I.C. informed.

Gerald Griffin with J.J. Walsh in the shop of the latter, 26 Blessington St. for a considerable time between 4 & 5 p.m. Griffin, it may be remembered, is the pro-German

About 20 members of the Sinn Fein Volunteers, carrying rifles, left 41 Parnell Square at 12 noon and marched to St. Enda's, Rathfarnham, on the grounds of which a Gaelic tournament was held.
