With Thomas J. Clarke, 75 Parnell St., P. Tobin for a few minutes at 10.30 a.m. John O'Mahony, Thomas Byrne, John McGarry and Geo. Nichols (Galway), together for an hour from 11.30 a.m. J.O'Connor for half an hour between 9&10 p.m. F. Fahy at Island Bridge at 8.30 a.m.

P.H. Pearse left Broadstone by 1.30 a.m. train for Ballinrobe, R.I.C. informed.

Major John McBride in Sackville St. between 1 & 2 p.m.

George Nicholls returned to Galway by 5 p.m. train, Broadstone.

Bulmer Hobson, P. Ryan, C. Colbert, and H. Mellows in Volunteer Office 2 Dawson St. for two hours from 8 p.m.

Forty Sinn Fein Volunteers, without rifles, assembled at 25 Parnell Square at 8 p.m.
