Subject, MOVEMENTS OF DUBLIN EXTREMISTS.

I beg to report that on the 14th inst the undermentioned extremists were observed moving about and associating with each other as follows :-

McCabe (ex-tram conductor) together for half an hour between 10 & 11p.m. after which Clarke closed his shop for the night.

M. O'Hanrahan in the Sinn Fein Volunteer Office, 2 Dawson St., at 11.30 a.m.

Gerald Griffin with J.J. Walsh in the shop of the latter for ten minutes between 2 & 3 p.m.

D. Lynch passing along Dame St. towards College Green between 4&5 p.m.

There was no Strike Meeting held at Crumlin on 14th inst, and nothing unusual occurred in the vicinity during the day
