Subject, CITIZEN ARMY ASSEMBLY AT CROYDON PARK.

With reference to The Under Secretarys Minute on this file, I beg to report that 150 members of the Citizen Army, 12 in uniform, and 45 carrying rifles assembled at Croydon Park, Fairview, about 4 p. m., 19th. inst., arriving in small groups.

They left the Park at 6.15 p. m., and headed by a Pipers Band, marched to Liberty Hall, Beresford Place, where they separated at 7 p. m.
